## PRESIDENT



Wow what a strange season it was 2019-2020. It wasn't really a great summer when it counted most on weekends with weather & surf conditions impeding junior activities & surf sports events during the season. South Coast Bush Fires & Covid-19 had an enormous impact on society. Our thoughts & prayers to all that lost loved ones & possessions in these horrible times.

We had members assist with emergency call outs with the bush fires & as we know our George Bass Surf Boat Marathon squad was down in Bermagui over New Years Eve. With the event called off I was so proud & impressed by our club member's commitment in volunteering in many & varied roles to assist those in need. For 48 hours it was quite scary & surreal in those circumstances. We also had members attend overnight to Sussex Inlet to assist with the bush fires in December. Thank you Jason Colquhoun & Dave Kohler.

To top things off the season ends early with Covid-19. Patrols cease some 5 weeks early, Australian Surf Life Saving Championships are cancelled, end of season debriefs cancelled and social activities on hold. It really was a strange way to finish in what for us was a pretty successful season. We have had a couple of ZOOM management meetings once the season was shut down sorting through matters which needed to be addressed. We continue to keep our members informed with Covid-19 updates & likely time frames for surf life saving activities to return to normal.

In saying that, our members should be proud of their efforts across all aspects of club activities. The Annual Report again

highlights the achievements of our members and for that I thank you personally for your efforts. Thanks to Paul Hennessy for putting this annual report together, again another good read.

*'No Lives lost whilst our members patrol Bulli Beach 107 years.'* Every member that wears the red & yellow patrol uniform to make our beach safe for the community, you are to be congratulated for your efforts.

With the building extensions complete, usage of the surf club on a daily basis is happening. A massive thankyou to Paul Hennessy our DOA but also functions coordinator, the work behind the scenes is enormous.

Success of the club in its aims & objectives I believe is built around key elements to support the achievement of those goals, basically the entrustment of ownership and delegated authority to selected senior members of the Board and Management Committee. It enables these members to drive outcomes with minimum supervision to ensure that agreed targets and milestones across all key areas are met. Key areas and their nominated responsible members are:

- **Life Saving** - Markus Meier-Lindner, Jamie Thorpe, Dave Kohler
- **Education** - Jamie Caldwell, Markus Meier-Lindner, Nathan Flint

These members are required to regularly report to the Board and Management Committee to ensure that operational activities continue to support the achievement of strategic goals, and that risks of any kind are managed in a proactive manner.

One massive achievement as a club was our Summer Surf Festival in late November/early December. Hosting four major surf sports events was a resounding success. The feedback from key stakeholders was impressive. SLSA going so far to say it was the *'best facilitated carnival by a work force'* (Kellogg's Nutri Grain Iron Series) & SLSNSW highlighting that 'Bulli is now the bench mark for hosting NSW Inter-

Branch Championships'. SLSA President, Graham Ford, parting words were, *'we will be back!!'*

Two weekends in succession with the final round of the local Sydney Water Surf Series plus SLSA Surf League Teams Challenge & then Kellogg's Nutri Grain Iron Series, with the following weekend being the SLSNSW Inter-Branch Championships. Visitor numbers to our beach over the 2 weekends were estimated at 10,000 people. The club working as one volunteer body, a massive achievement for all concerned. In total, thousands of hours in planning, labour & hosting these events really showcased a strong all-round lifesaving club.

To the members that took on roles during the season, Patrol Captains to Age Managers at Nippers, coaches within surf sports programs, water safety, BBQ helpers, all in a voluntary capacity, thank you so much. Same comment comes up each season, *'the future of the club is looking extremely good.'*

Total membership figures for the last 4 seasons:

- 2016/2017 - 506
- 2017/2018 - 586
- 2018/2019 - 592
- 2019/2020 - 654

This is a staggering 29.25% increase in membership in 3 seasons. Can any other clubs boast these figures with increased membership? Each season we continue to raise the bar with each section working hard to come together to make this proud club a very good surf lifesaving club.

Thank you to Markus Meier-Lindner & Jamie Caldwell who work together with Life Saving & Education, helping the club put members through education awards & ultimately wearing the red & yellow cap, patrolling our beach for the community. Assisting these guys on a regular basis to name a few are Jamie Thorpe, Dave Kohler, Jason Colquhoun, Paul Brightwell & Nathan Flint.

Surf Sports continues to be strong within the club from junior activities right through to masters. Illawarra, New South Wales & Australian reps all in one season. Special mention to our Open Men's Boat crew on gaining Australian rep honours, an outstanding reward for this very committed bunch of guys. Results are listed in this annual report, congratulations to

everybody that raced in the maroon and gold cap this season. As always thank you to all of our club coaches, team managers, water safety, power-craft personnel, officials & supporting parents, you people are valued by the club & our members. Unfortunately, the season was cut short due to Branch Championships (surf & weather) & Aussies (covid-19) being cancelled.

Junior Activities Section had a mixed season with the weather & surf conditions impacting on Sunday mornings a bit, but that didn't dampen the enthusiasm of kids, parents & helpers. Well done to Josh Woodford as the new Chairperson & his hardworking committee. Numbers were on the increase again & it was great to see new members putting their hands up to take on roles.

Thank you to all our sponsors who contribute in any way, it is greatly appreciated. Every little bit helps us to maintain our financial sustainability and work towards our objectives of having first class lifesaving equipment available to our members, deliver the training, support and services to assist with development in education, lifesaving & surf sports to our members.

Not to forget Geraldine Miller was awarded Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Australia, a great honour & achievement for all the hard work you have put in over many decades to the organisation.

Prior to this annual report being published we had a critical incident that occurred in early June 2020 which I must make mention of. On the Saturday evening our Emergency Call Out Team were activated with reports of people calling for help. During the search it was established that at about 6.20pm Saturday 6 June 2020, a boat carrying four people capsized near Bulli Point (Peggy's Reef). 10 members of our call out team responded on the Saturday evening along with Police Officers from Wollongong Police District – with assistance from the Marine Area Command, PolAir, the Toll Ambulance helicopter, Marine Rescue, Surf Life Saving Illawarra Duty Officer & Bulli SLSC members – commenced a search.

That evening at about 8pm, two men aged 31 and 23, were pulled from the water by the Toll Ambulance Helicopter and taken to Wollongong hospital for treatment. Due to conditions, the search was suspended at 12am (Sunday 7 June 2020), for the two other people reported missing. The capsized boat was towed into Port Kembla Harbour early

Sunday morning where Police divers located the body of a five-year-old boy, so very sad. From 6am Sunday Bulli SLSC members along with members from 10 other Illawarra surf life-saving clubs, SLSI Support Operations Team, SLSNSW Duty Officer, WCC Lifeguards, along with emergency service personnel from NSW Police & NSW Ambulance commenced a search of the immediate area (north & south water & land) for the 1 missing person. Unfortunately, the body of a man was recovered from the water near Corrimal about 1.10pm. The search was then concluded.



More than 30 members from Bulli SLSC assisted over a 24hr period with the surf club as the Command Post. So very proud of our members who performed duties in cold, adverse conditions on the Saturday night & then again Sunday. From coordinating operational matters to being on the water in IRB's or RWC, to cooking the BBQ & having food & refreshments available for everybody, thank you so much. It really showed what our surf club & its members are about. They really stepped up during a very challenging incident, Well Done to everybody.



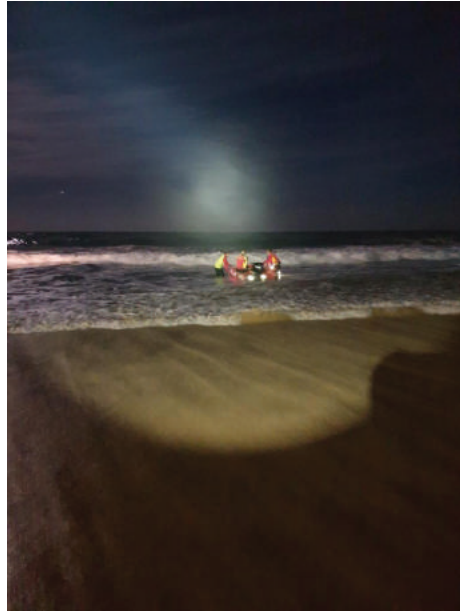
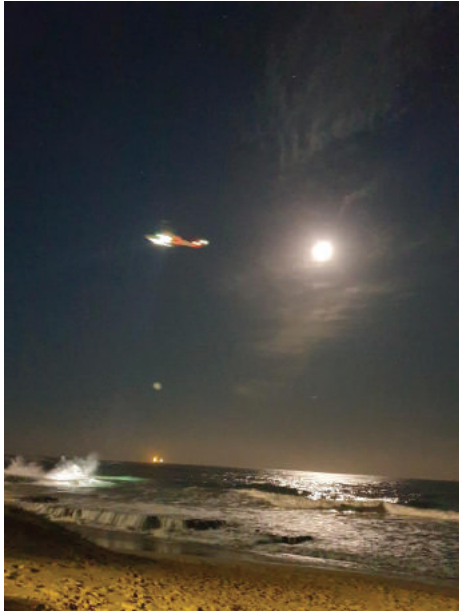
Looking forward to seeing everybody back on the beach come September this year for season 2020-2021.

## LIFESAVING

Thank You!

Another very successful patrol season lies behind us - the Club's 107th without lives lost whilst on patrol. Thank you very much all rostered patrolling members and additional volunteers for their time, their professionalism and for applying their great skills to keep visitors at Bulli Beach safe.

In addition to our consistently strong lifesaving performance our most considerable achievement last season was the hosting of three major and highly visible surf sports events across two consecutive weekends. They were Rd 4 of Sydney Water Series and Rd 3 of Kellogs Nutri-Grain Series (30 November, 1 December) as well as Interbranch (7 & 8 December). The feedback we received as a club was extremely positive throughout with all event owners feeling well supported and their events well run. In case of the Kellogs Nutri-Grain event SLSA staff went as far as stating Bulli had set a new benchmark in running and supporting such events. They were particularly impressed by the large numbers of members helping out including those who provided lifesaving services and water safety. That included setting, changing and packing up of courses and constant water safety as well as additional patrols who were kept busy with a lot of first aid provisions and supportive event logistics, e.g. the distribution of food and water to officials. Thank you very much to everyone for your tireless efforts and support to make each of these events a resounding success.

COVID-19 changed everything in regards to the delivery of lifesaving services and patrols from early March. It included using only minimum numbers while maintaining all

compulsory qualifications and equipment as we had to adhere to social distancing rules. We ultimately saw the cancellation of all patrolling activities effective 27 March, which cut the patrol season short by five weeks including the Easter long weekend as well as the ANZAC Day weekend. Instead of providing patrols the Emergency Callout Team was put on 24/7 alert from the same day forward, five weeks earlier than it normally would have been. Thank you very much to its members for your ongoing willingness and availability.

We acknowledge that these circumstances may have been challenging for many of us and we hope you have been able to cope and to adjust as best as you can.

Overall the past season was a success story as this summary demonstrates:

- The ratio of rescues per preventative actions continues to increase to 157 this year by 114% following a 17% increase in 2018/19, a 11% increase in 2017/18 and a 217% increase in 2016/17
- Maximum number of patrolling hours of any member during 2019/20 was 93.5, (+0.5 hours from last season) indicating an ongoing 'good sharing of the load'
- 10 patrolling members did 50 patrol hours or more
- The Operations App was used consistently by all patrol teams from the start of the season
- There were no patrolling related incidents or injuries of any patrolling members
- There were no significant equipment related problems during the entire season

Looking at below statistics it is important to acknowledge that most of the decreases have occurred due to the cancellation of all patrols effective 27 March 2020.

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## SURF SPORTS

Although 2019 – 2020 was the year with plenty of disruptions when it came to surf sports (fires during the George Bass Surf Boat Marathon, Branch called off due to dangerous surf and the Aussies called off due to Covid 19), Bulli still achieved some fantastic results throughout the Surf Sports season.

The Junior club training / coaches are providing a great foundation for the younger competitors and our senior section of the club has over the last couple of years started to benefit from the time and effort put into the juniors. 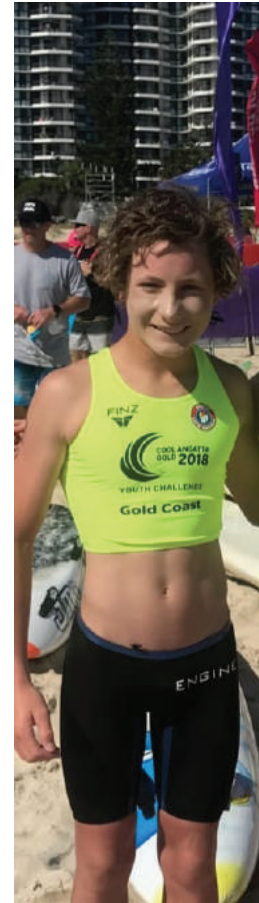

## BOAT CAPTAIN

In my last ever Boat Captains Report I am finding it hard to describe the 2019/2020 season. It has been both significant and insignificant at the same time. COVID-19 has overshadowed events that I thought could never be overshadowed.

This report should be read with the knowledge that sport, our sport, any sport, is insignificant in health and economic times like these. But, three quarters of the season did take place. People worked hard and achieved great results, so this report is to ensure that their efforts are acknowledged and recorded.

Our season has been successful, but not without disappointment. The A crew returned to the national team and went on to win the Trans-Tasman series 3-0. They were leading the Ocean Thunder series and looked primed to return to the top of the podium come the national titles. Along the way they fell agonisingly short of an 8th straight NSW State title – placing second. Reaching the top of the sport is hard but staying there is harder. Conversations during lockdown about whether our A crew is the best of the last 30 years raged nation-wide. The general consensus was that, like similar conversations in other sports, it was hard to compare when they had not raced the great North Cottesloe crew of the mid-2000s but they were worthy of their place in the conversation. Unlike the other top crews in the conversation, our A crew has lost the chance to compete in 2 of the last 5 Aussie titles when they were favourites each time. Having arrived on the scene in 2011, won their first NSW State title in 2012, I can't remember a crew consistently dominating a decade like they have and they are rightly consider the best of the last decade and one of the best ever.

The Reserve women's crew rowed well all season and took silver at the NSW State titles, a fitting reward for their efforts over the last few years. They too looked set to have a real shot at success come the national titles. These girls train hard, row hard and give back to the Club at every opportunity. They deserve their success this year and I wish them all the best for next year.

The junior crew really announced themselves this year and our club's rowing future remains bright. Jonesy managed to juggle a crew of 7 without compromising boat speed. The boys rowed well all season, generally without luck, and it left the management team with a tough decision when it came time to settle on a crew of 4 for the Nationals. It was clear that any combination would have been competitive, and I know that they, along with the other two crews, had a genuine shot of winning gold.

This year's George Bass Marathon was an experience. We sent down three crews to contest the event, a total of 54 adults and 32 kids in camp. This was a massive logistical exercise, made more challenging by the events which unfolded down the coast. Our Open crew was declared the winner, making it a record 4 straight wins in the event. I am sure all know the story about what unfolded but in summary, in the early hours of 31 December 2019, the bushfire burning west of Bermagui made a run for the coast, destroying Cobargo on the way. We were camping at the showground in Bermagui. This spot would become the evacuation point. During the next 24 hours all that is good about the surf lifesaving movement swung into gear. Our members helped where they could, be it entering data as evacuees attended the command centre, cooking food or simply making cups of coffee for distraught locals. Those 24 hours will stay with all of us, especially our children, and so it must. We as a club need to continue to focus on what is important to us, our sense of service, our sense of community but most importantly, our sense of supporting each other during times of need.

I would like to thank the committee for their continued support, our sponsors who continue to dig deep, our sweeps who keep crews on the water, our officials who keep us in competition, our supporters who keep backing us, the leadership group who keep providing guidance and the Vice-Boat Captain, Dean Roberts for his help and support this year. I have lost count of the number of seasons I have occupied the role of Boat Captain – around 13 or so – but now is the time to pass the baton on. It is my hope that Dean takes on the role next year. He has shown a keen interest and exhibited great leadership. I will stay on as Vice-Boat Captain for at least another year to assist with the transition. I hope that he receives the same level of support that I have received over the years.

In signing off, I think it is appropriate that I thank my wife, Nicola. As with many long serving members of our club, we are a silent double-act. She picks up the slack when I am busy and understands when something comes up at the last minute. I could not have done it without her.

In Nov/Dec, we hosted a trilogy of major surf sports events being the Sydney Water series, NSW Inter-branch Championships and the Kelloggs Nutri-grain Ironman Series over two consecutive weekends. Due to a plethora of awesome volunteers we raised almost \$20K across the events and showcased our club spirit for all to see.

Again, we are fortunate to be in a healthy financial position. Our past financial discipline will enable us to continue to serve the community well despite an expected drop in income this year. As a club, we will do everything we can to support our members and the community through this difficult time and I wish everyone a healthy return to our environment in the coming months.

**Notes to the Financial Statements**

**For the year ended 31 May 2020**

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**Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

**(a) Receivables**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

**(c) Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

**(d) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

**(e) Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

**For the year ended 31 May 2020**

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Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**(f) Leases**

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

**(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

**(h) Investments**

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the association to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the committee regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.



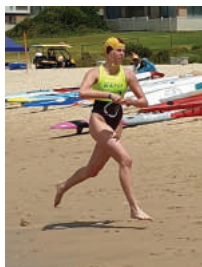

What a proud moment this season when Geraldine Miller was awarded Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Australia. A massive honour as Geraldine was Bulli Surf & Craft Head Coach from 2001 to 2006 and is a member of the club this past season.

Geraldine has spent decades watching her kids grow from nippers to master's athletes. She is still attending surf carnivals, now watching her grandchildren compete.

Here's a bit of an insight into Geraldine's more than twenty year involvement in surf lifesaving:

- has been a member of Shoalhaven Heads, North Curl Curl & Bulli Surf Life Saving Clubs
- the first female to gain Level 3 surf sports coach accreditation
- the first female to coach & manager Australian Surf Life Saving teams (2003)
- coached & managed NSW & NSW Country teams
- involvement in panels/committees for SLSNSW & SLSA concerning athlete welfare
- 2003-2005 Assistant Coach Australian High-Performance Squad
- 2005 Head Coach Surf Life Saving Illawarra Integral Energy Development Squad
- 2006 SLSA High-Performance Squad Advisor
- coach of Bulli SLSC teams to World Championships 2002 Daytona Beach USA, 2004 Viareggio Italy & Lorne Australia.

Geraldine was a trailblazer for women in surf lifesaving. A self-confessed book worm who never obtained a bronze

medallion, she learnt from some of the best coaches to become one of the best coaches in Australia herself. A Level 2 strength & conditioning coach, she facilitated many senior coaching courses and nipper clinics, also presenting at numerous high-performance camps at State and National level. She also held roles of official's advisor at State & National Championships.

Her biggest strength was her ability to positively influence the lives of children & adolescents. She thrived on helping young people reach their full potential as athletes and as human beings. Her athletes presented her with a plaque in 2005 & the headline sums it up... 'Life Coach, Coach of a Lifetime'. She had a unique & calming perspective which enhanced confidence in athletes, officials and anyone who met her.

As Head Coach, the results of Bulli SLSC surf and craft squad over a five-year period were outstanding and included;
